



PASTOR'S CORNER



You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you.

The New American Bible translation we use in the liturgy has cleared up the usual problem with Jesus' words in this passage but in doing so has obscured the word play – In Greek the idiom used for 'pruning' a vine is 'to clean it'. Jesus in the Gospel literally says the Father cleans every branch that bears fruit so that it bears more fruit. And You are already clean because of the word that I spoke to you.

There is a link there between this pruning of the vine and the purification of our souls. If we want to bear more fruit, we have to allow ourselves to be pruned: to be cleansed, to be purified.

And indeed, we have already been cleansed not by the work we have done, but because of the word that he has spoken to us: the word of Scripture that prunes and purifies if we truly listen and take it to heart; the word of the Sacraments, especially the cleansing word of baptism and confession; and the Word who is Christ himself, who is the true vine such that Whoever remains in him . . . will bear much fruit, because without him we can do nothing.

The expectation is that we are bearing fruit. By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples. And so if it seems we're not bearing fruit, not leading people to Christ, not showing forth to the world that love with which Christ has loved us, then maybe we need to let God do a little more pruning – a little more purification to rid our life of our attachments to material things and to sin. Maybe we need to reflect on whether we truly have become his disciples – listening at the feet of Christ and his Church and letting his words remain in us.

May we continue to be purified by his word as we give ourselves all the more as his disciples – that we may bear more fruit and that the Father maybe glorified through us.
